behalf of our Sovereign Lady the  
Queen touching the death of  
Sumah an Indian at the Provincial  
Hall in New Westminster in the  
County of Westminster on the  
16<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year  
of our Lord one thousand eight  
hundred and ninety one before me  
J. Pettibon, Esquire, one of  
Her Majesty's Coronors for the said  
County, on an Inquisition then and  
there taken on the view of the  
body of the said Sumah an  
Indian then and there lying dead  
as follows, to wit:

Sherrif W. J. Armstrong of New  
Westminster in the said County of  
Westminster upon oath said that I  
produce the Calendar of the Assize  
Court New Westminster 18<sup>th</sup> November  
1890 certifying the said Indian  
Sumah to be hanged by the neck  
until dead on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of January  
A. D. 1891
