

9 Dr. Walter, M. D. of New Westminster in the said County of Westminster being sworn said, I made a post-mortem examination of the body of Louie Bee at New Westminster on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of September, A. D. 1890. I found the body lying in an out house on front street, had some clothing on and covered with a blanket he is a well developed man of about 25 or 30 years of age, on examining the body I found a wound on the outside of the left shoulder apparently produced by a bullet, there were no other recent marks of violence on the body. On probing the wound I found it ran downwards and inwards on tracing the course of the bullet I found the humerus more badly fractured on the upper part, the bullet fractured the chest passing into the same and through the left lung entered the left auricle of the heart and passed out therefrom into and through the right auricle appendix then through the right lung and was found loose in the right pleural cavity both pleural cavities were full of blood. I examined the stomach and found no indication that he had been drinking recently, death must have been produced

almost instantaneously, from
