Says Search for Prospector Not Necessary

Provincial Constables Stevenson and Murphy. the former also a game warden. left this morning on the ferry New Delta for Pitt Lake, for the purpose of instituting a search for an old prospector known as Volcano [sic] Brown, who is supposed to be in the mountains. They will pick up Roy McMartin, trapper, who has a close acquaintance with the district, and endeavor to discover Brown or traces of him. Brown was seen in August by another prospector named Swanson, who came out at that time, after selling Brown some of his supplies. According to Swanson, Brown had enough grub to last till the middle of September and should have been out long ago.

Laurits Frederiksen, rancher and prospector, Steelhead, came to the office of The British Columbian today and volunteered that he knows Brown well and in his opinion no one need institute a search for the old prospector as he was well able to look after himself.

Brown was the object of a similar search some years ago but turned up all right.
